Processing times may vary, but decisions are generally made within three weeks. It's advisable to apply well in advance of your intended travel date.

Permitted and Restricted Activities With this visa, visitors can:

Enjoy tourism and leisure activities

Visit friends or relatives

Attend business meetings or interviews

Participate in short courses (less than 30 days)

However, holders are not allowed to:

Work or take paid/unpaid employment

Live in the UK for extended periods

Access public funds

Marry or register a civil partnership without a specific visa
