5. How to Narrow Down Your Final Choice

- Observe the mood of students, teacher-student interactions, campus energy.
- A warm, motivated school culture often counts more than flashy infrastructure.

6. Common Mistakes to Avoid

- Choosing solely based on reputation or the “big name” without confirming the fit for *your* child.
- Ignoring commute or transport constraints, especially for younger children.
- Overlooking the full cost of schooling (activities, transport, tuitions) after the base fee.
- Not verifying the actual classroom experience: sometimes labs and smart-classes exist but aren’t used effectively.
